Wing Stands Ready to Serve Louisiana

From the youngest cadet to the most senior member, the Louisiana Wing stands ready to serve Louisiana and the nation. The wing's volunteer members have a long and distinguished history of service before self.

Focusing on three primary programs — emergency services, cadet programs, and aerospace education — members serve in many capacities, ranging from disaster response to community service, including adjunct support of classroom teachers.

"We constantly strive to expand our outreach to the community," said Col. James Viney, Louisiana Wing commander. "This includes interfacing with educators, emergency responders, and community leaders in both urban and rural areas of the state."

The wing has carried out ongoing collaborations with agencies such as the American Red Cross and the U.S. Coast Guard along with state and local emergency response management teams.

Exceptional classroom materials developed by Civil Air Patrol contribute to the promotion of STEM education in Louisiana schools. Through a network of trained teachers and CAP mentors, the Aerospace Connections in Education program provides important lessons for students across the state.

The wing's cadet program prepares youth to become leaders in their communities. Through the aerospace education program, they're poised for a future in the military or STEM fields.
